Critical Reminders – These could save your life and lives of your passengers

Last year the father of a friend of mine was killed in a plane crash during takeoff. He was the PIC. The resulting investigation has revealed some startling facts that are both chilling and serve as reminders to all of us to maintain our vigilance, to always follow SOPs, to avoid complacency and to conduct a 30 second review prior to initiating any takeoff or landing.

It turns out that the gust-lock on the aircraft (a corporate jet) was still locked when the pilots attempted to takeoff. A compounding element was the fact that an abort was not initiated until more than 7 seconds AFTER reaching V1. To no surprise, they went off the end of the runway with little chance of survival. All souls on board were killed.

Following the accident it was discovered that the crew failed to perform ANY checklists. There is not one recording of any checklist being accomplished prior to engine start, after engine start,

during taxi or prior to takeoff. Not one. Prior to flight the crew is required to ensure that all flight controls are free. This is a checklist item of course.

This is yet another example of how critical it is that we continue to maintain our discipline at all times. The captain had been flying for more than 30 years with tens of thousands of hours. This crash illustrates that we are ALL subject to complacency.

From one professional to another, I use this sad example as a reminder for all of us to remember these key items at all times:

1. Always follow SOPs

- 2. **Avoid complacency** never assume everything is going to be "all right." Always use checklists, keep your iPads on for map cross-checking or have paper charts open.
- 3. **Maintain Situational Awareness** this includes awareness of the relevant position of your aircraft with other aircraft, with the ground, with weather and obstacles. It also includes being aware of the condition of your aircraft, your crew and your passengers.
- 4. **Perform a 30 second review prior to every takeoff and approach** know what you would do prior to 80 knots, after 80 knots but before V1 and after V1. The same applies prior to initiating an approach.

These four easy steps are critical for maintain the highest level of safety. Thank you for all you do and for continuing to be a great pilot representative of Paramount. — *Michael W. Johnson*
